- Only the patient will be allowed in the office; if the patient is under 18, one parent may accompany him/her into the office.
- Patient and parent must come to the office with a mask on; unfortunately, we will be unable to permit entry to anyone who is not masked.
- Please call us as soon as you get to the parking lot. We will direct you at that time to either come up right away for the appointment or to wait in your car until we are ready for you. We are working on having a tight schedule so we ask you to please be on time.

- We have hand sanitizer that we will ask you to use when you enter the office. You will also find some in the reception area and other places in the office for you to use as needed.
- Please brush prior to your appointment, the brushing stations are temporarily closed.
